This event, headed by Sandy and Miles O'Brien, has quickly become a classic part of our July $4^{\rm th}$ activities. Over 650 participants resulted in \$13,000 being raised for the LRA Foundation.

Get ready for lots of excitement and see what Andrew has up his sleeve! Summer 2010 will be even better so mark your calendars and bring all your friends!



The LRA Board of Trustees wishes to thank you for the overwhelming participation in this year's survey. The survey was viewed by almost 450 members with a total completion rate of 76%, which is just incredible. In addition, your satisfaction with the survey itself was very high, so the board intends to use your input as a reference tool as we move into the future. Enjoy a few of the statistics garnered from the survey.

The Survey Says....

Who we are:

- Nearly all respondents are over 40 years of age with half being over 60
- 19% are fulltime residents with 24% planning to be in the future
- 29% vote in county and another 28% are willing to vote in Rabun Co.
- 62% either volunteer now or in the past for the LRA
- 47% non-fulltime residents spend more than 30 days a year at the lake
