The Boater Safety and Certification Class is a DNR-taught program covering a wide range of Boater Safety Topics. Children ages 12-15 are required by law to take (and pass) this class, but the topics covered are so important and far-reaching to overall Boating Safety that all ages are encouraged to attend. Those who attend will be fed and prizes will be given away to everyone. Stay as long as you can, but we hope you will stay for the whole class and become a CERTIFIED LAKE RABUN SAFE BOATING CAPTAIN!

Some, but not all, of the topics covered:

- Boater Safety Checklists
- Rules and Regulations of Boating
- General Rules of the Water
- DNR's involvement at Lake Rabun
- Deputy Program
- How you can become a better driver
- How we can make the lake safer

This class runs in conjunction with the LRA's hopes of educating our community on Safe Boating Practices and further ties us in with our friends at the DNR. They are very supportive of this initiative, and we, in turn, hope to show our support of the DNR with a large turnout to this event.

Water Quality

The Tallulah River Watershed Council

We have previously reported on activities of the Tallulah River Watershed Council, a group of local volunteers focused on various issues of interest and concern within the watershed. The Water Quality Task Force of the TRWC recently finished an extensive analysis of water quality issues throughout the watershed, complete with recommendations regarding new practices believed to be important in assuring that water quality remains at high levels for the foreseeable future.

The Task Force met with representatives of Georgia Power Company to discuss the recommendations, and is currently developing plans for funding and implementing the relevant portions of the overall recommendations. The TRWC's Communications Task Force is currently working to create a website for the TRWC, and the full report from the Water Quality Task Force will be one of the first items to be posted on the website. We will advise you of the status of the website development and availability of the water quality report in a future newsletter.

Your Lake Rabun Neighbors Are Saving Hemlocks! *Are You?*



I am pleased to see and learn that many of our neighbors are saving their hemlocks. I get many unsolicited, very positive comments everywhere I go, confirming that awareness of the hemlock problem around our lake is at a high level and that the recommended treatments are really making a noticeable difference.

In late 2011 Georgia Power Company granted access and permission to LRA to treat hemlocks on their unoccupied property surrounding Lake Rabun. As quickly as possible, a plan was devised and two of your trained LRA Hemlock Facilitators and two volunteers began hemlock treatments on the unoccupied property along the shoreline of the "Narrows". The infestation is easily visible here and this area would not otherwise be treated. About 25% of the "Narrows" area was treated by this small group of four, before winter weather precluded any further treatments.

Due to the level of infestation in the "Narrows", the more aggressive chemical, Safari, was required to treat such large and/or sick hemlocks, particularly on the rough, overgrown, rocky, steep terrain in which they grow. A basal trunk spray is the only practical method of application in situations like this. Safari is a highly effective, stronger chemical and basal trunk spray application can be a do-it-yourself project, just as the soil injection application.

In the spring of 2012, the hemlock treatment project was restarted as soon as the weather permitted. A larger group, eighteen in number, of trained Lake Rabun Hemlock Facilita-

tors and other volunteers came together to treat additional hemlocks along the "Narrows" shoreline. The treatment of approximately 80% of the hemlocks in this area was completed. An additional project work day was scheduled for four very committed volunteers who brought the project to a conclusion during the first week of April. These treatments cannot bring back the lower dead limbs or dead trees, but will help to restore the lush green color and density of the needles on the treated hemlocks which precludes additional hemlocks from dying, thus preserving the natural beauty of this area.

These trained hemlock facilitators and volunteers have given freely of their time and "significant effort" to benefit all of us in preserving the lake we know, love and enjoy. Have you looked at your hemlocks? Have you treat-



ed or had your hemlocks treated? The infestation is extremely heavy this spring and infested hemlocks will be significantly impacted as will healthy, but untreated hemlocks. Take action today to preserve your untreated hemlocks to preserve the beauty of your property as well as the overall beauty of our lake. Don't let your property become the example of a neighbor who did not act.

For those of you who desire help, remember that the Lake Rabun Association has trained hemlock facilitators that are available to provide free on-site consultations to inspect your hemlocks and explain your treatment choices. Check the LRA web site at www.lakerabun.org under the Hemlock Program tab for contact information for Bob Pledger, Buz Stone, Dick Simms, George Longino, Hank Roper, Louis Belline and Ruddy Deas, our lake facilitators.

Paraphrasing an adage, "It takes a community to save our hemlocks...and the beauty of our lake." A stalwart, proactive group of our lake community has taken action, both on their own respective properties as well as unoc-



cupied Georgia Power property. Are you doing your part?
