## Lake Rabun Online Map

We hope that everyone is enjoying the new LRA online map first posted in July. Now the new, fun part! After you have confirmed that your personal location and information on the map are correct, you can send us a picture of your boathouse from the lake and it will pop up along with your information! **If you haven't confirmed your location, here's how you do it.**

1. Log in to your LRA account with your user name and password on the official LRA website. If you are on a computer, the login is in the top right corner of the home page. (Reminder: Your user name is the family surname of your membership, followed by your lot number. Example: Smith124.5)
2. After you log in, "Members Only" will appear on the Menu toolbar.
3. Click "Members Only".
4. The fifth title down is "Boathouse Map".
5. Once there you can type in a name or a lot number and it will show you the boathouse you are trying to locate.
6. If you find a mistake, let us know and we can correct it! (jennymcclure13@hotmail.com) How great is that!

## LRA SCHOLARSHIP

Recently Anne Pledger reached out to a Rabun Scholar who had encountered a setback in her academic journey. Callie Flack, with the North Georgia Community Foundation, worked with Anne to address the situation. Callie mentioned that she had just attended a conference dealing with the graduation rates of students in Georgia colleges. She told Anne what she heard was that all too often “life happens” and students drop out of college with every intention to go back—but, in fact, they rarely did. She explained that the difference in a student with financial issues staying in school or not attending is often as little as \$400! We often think it is the big money that keeps kids in school rather than just the few hundred dollars they might lack. The conference brought home the value of LRA scholarships and the importance of our working with students who are serious about finishing school when “life” gets in the way.



Callie wrote “thanks to you and all the Lake Rabun folks for providing these scholarships and for being so involved in keeping up with the kids to ensure they get their scholarships and helping them along the way.”

**THANK YOU, THANK YOU** to Laura Rhodes and Kelly Cowan, co-chairs of the most successful Flea Market in LRA history. The Lake Rabun Foundation AND the Lakemont Wiley Volunteer Fire Department EACH received \$34,650 from the Flea Market.

Sandy O’Brien headed the Rabun Ramble which had a record turnout and raised \$17,000 for the Foundation

David Stromquist led the golf tournament which raised nearly \$8,000 for the Foundation.

## SCHOLARSHIPS

The Lake Rabun Foundation was established to provide scholarship assistance in Rabun County. In 2013 the Foundation achieved a milestone by awarding a scholarship to the 100<sup>th</sup> student from Rabun County! That has been – and will continue to be-- the primary focus of the Lake Rabun Foundation.

As we build the assets of the Foundation we will be able to provide additional scholarships and, hopefully, increase the amount of our grants.

## ESTATE PLANNING

## RABUN MENTOR OPPORTUNITY

For 10 years Jeanne Tillman has led a successful program which seeks to match mentors with Rabun County Middle School (grades 7 & 8) students. Jeanne, a counselor with RCMS suggests “it is important for students to have adults in their lives who believe in them and encourage them to pursue their dreams.” Mentors typically spend 45 minutes each week with their student. ## Rabun Challenges

In a recent article, Matt Arthur, the highly respected superintendent of Rabun County Schools, had some interesting observations about Rabun County High School. A dozen years ago, RCHS had a graduation rate of 63% and only 25 students taking Advanced Placement classes. Last year, the school reported a graduation rate of 90.2% and 248 students in AP classes! Arthur also pointed out that while graduation rates and the quality of education had risen, another factor that often limits academic success had risen as well: the poverty rate! According to Arthur, a preliminary finding for the 2013-2014 school year showed that almost 75% of students within the school system would qualify for free or reduced lunch. This falls in line with statistics released by the school system that indicated 61.6% of students live in poverty, an increase from 41.4% in 2000. Few counties have been able to boost graduation rates with comparable socio-economic demographic according to Arthur. While one might debate the precise number, the trends are clear. Academic achievement is improving in the midst of a depressed economic area.

Your support of the Lake Rabun Foundation addresses both sides of this equation. This year **29** Rabun students will receive scholarship assistance for college or technical school.

A major factor in the selection of these high achieving recipients is NEED. In addition to academic achievement, character and potential for future success, the selection committee focuses on a range of issues which determine financial need.

Through our Community Outreach effort your Lake Rabun Foundation supports a variety of programs which seek to assist children and their development in Rabun County. Your Foundation impacts children through The Food 2 Kids Program, CASA, Richard’s Kids, Foxfire, The First Foundation for Childhood Literacy and a 4-H grant. These entities receive a significant portion of the Foundation’s grants.

Thank you for your financial support of the Lake Rabun Foundation and for your participation in the events such as the Flea Market, Rabun Ramble, the Tour of Homes and the golf tournament, which contribute to the Foundation.

- Mathis Dam was begun in 1912, even before Tallulah Falls Dam was finished. The rock that was mined at Lake Rabun and used in the concrete turned out to have too much mica in it so they had to tear it out and start over. Rock had to be brought up from Tallulah Falls.
- The corn crib, called Bluebird Cottage, was always in the location it is in now. It was not moved from the bottom of the lake to the shore.
- One of the few men who knew the formula for Coca Cola had a home on Lake Rabun.
