Dorothy Ann King Honored with 2015 Buz Stone Award

Long time Rabun CASA (court appointed special advocate), Dorothy Ann King, was presented the 2015 Buz Stone "Lake Rabun Cares" Award. Dorothy Ann was a member of the first CASA volunteer training class in 2004 sworn in as advocates for children in Rabun County. CASA volunteers represent

children in foster care. that ensuring physical, emotional, and educational needs are met. They strive to find safe, permanent homes for children. In her 11 years as a volunteer, Dorothy Ann has advocated for 22 children in Rabun County. No one was surprised to learn that Dorothy Ann has a reputation as a spirited. tenacious defender of the children assigned to her.



The Buz Stone Award was created in 2012 to honor Buz for his 25 years of leadership with the Lake Rabun Foundation. Recipients reflect the "spirit of Buz Stone and the goodwill of LRA Members" in serving the welfare of Rabun County. The award carries with it a \$2,500 grant, which Dorothy Ann directed to Northeast Georgia CASA.

Lake Rabun Foundation Update

This fall, there are THIRTY Rabun scholars attending college with the support of Lake Rabun Scholarships. Five more students from Rabun County attending North Georgia Technical College have requested and received grants to assist them with school expenses. Each week, it seems we hear stories of the successes, and challenges, of our scholarship students. In many cases, the LRA Connections person has been there to celebrate or help work through a roadblock. Thanks to Nan Troutman and Anne Pledger for making all this possible.

Leckie Stack, who heads our Outreach program, has helped define our "mission". As community partners, the Lake Rabun Foundation seeks to improve lives in Rabun County through support of local organizations involved in education, child welfare, food ministries, environmental programs and community development. Focus will be on programs which encourage long term efforts to develop people, promote self-sufficiency and improve the standard of living. Leckie and her

team regularly meet with local organizations to better understand and evaluate the work they are doing. Hollis Heeney recently joined this committee and brings insight to ways we might impact the local schools and their mentoring efforts. The Foundation budgeted \$30,000 for Outreach grants in 2015.

A special thanks to Bob Voyles, who has been the inspiration for the Centennial Celebration. Proceeds from these efforts will support the work of the Foundation. Betty King and Andrea Altholz headed a very successful art auction resulting in a net profit of \$27,514 to the Foundation. Once again, Sandy O'Brien was up early to lead a fun, family-friendly Rabun Ramble. Thanks to Kelly Keeler and Penny Burkitt for their efforts in providing Centennial flags, clothing and items for all of us. It is a team effort!

Our Annual Fund has become the financial cornerstone of our Foundation. Thanks to all who made this a record year for the Annual Fund. Lisa Longino and Ron Hinson introduced the 1915 Society to recognize those who have made provisions in their estate plans to support the work of the Foundation in years to come.

It is an honor to be part of all this good work. Steve Raeber



We not only lost a friend; we lost an advocate for those that help protect our families on the lake – the Lakemont Wiley Volunteer Fire Department. Winnie was a true champion of the fire department and worked hard raising funds for them having initiated the first Lake Rabun Flea Market and continuing that fundraiser for many years. Those funds helped transform Station 4 into the state-of-the-art facility that it is today.

The officers and the board reflected on her legacy and want to remember her in a special way. Naturally, we gravitated to her favorite cause, our volunteer fire department. As we did research to see what was needed, we found that there are not always enough funds for training these firefighters. With that in mind, LRA has chosen to remember Winnie in two ways. First, a plaque will be prominently displayed in the Lake Rabun Pavilion honoring her for her years of commitment and accomplishments. Additionally, we will be establishing a funding mechanism to support our Lakemont Wiley Volunteer Fire Department with ongoing training expenses. Stay tuned for more details.

The changes that have occurred over the years are numerous. And changes will continue, but at a much faster pace.

Who could have conceived of the internet, websites and email in those days? But we now have children and grandchildren who cannot understand a time when those things were not available. Technology to them is second nature.

Many of us rely on our children and grandchildren now for technical advice. A frequent answer I receive from them to my questions is "Google is your friend". The **lakerabun.org** website is also your friend when it comes to LRA and Lake Rabun news and activities. There is a wealth of information on our website and our Association continues to enhance the website to meet member needs by providing LRA and lake news, resources and information. Recent enhancements include:

- an indicator of year-round or full-time residency on or near the lake as our population of retirees grows
- choices for electronic delivery of The Clayton Tribune and LRA newsletters
- the inclusion of our Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws for quick and easy reference
- · expanded bulletin board
- conversion of a little-used database field to allow for the addition of a third email address in member profiles so others could access our website and receive eblasts

There is also a project underway to bring the Lake Rabun boathouse online map in-house to help facilitate timely updates and ensure that map info and database info are in sync.

Lake Rabun is scheduled to begin drawdown on November 29th, 2015. The lake will be down ten feet and is expected to begin refilling on December 20th. The lake should be back to normal pool on December 24th. Please remember if you have any plans for construction during the drawdown period, you will need to obtain a construction permit from Georgia Power.

Also as Fall and Winter approaches, remember that leaves and yard debris should be removed and not disposed of in the lake.

Lake Rabun Pavilion

Pavilion rentals continue to be made at a brisk pace, not only for LRA events, but also for weddings and multiple other community functions. In the past, the base rates were supplemented by chair and table usage rental fees, often requiring a second bill to renters after the event. That will change for 2016.

Rates will increase slightly for non-LRA events, but will include tables and chairs as needed at no additional cost. Full day rentals will range from \$1,200-\$1,500 depending on whether it is a peak or non- peak time. Partial day rentals range from \$600-\$750, depending on whether it is a peak or non-peak time. Finally, rates for events of 2 hours or less range from \$360 for non-peak times to \$450 for peak times.

Discounts for Lake Rabun Pavilion Navy renters, ranging from 10%-50%, also continue to be granted. Full rental details can be found on page 12 of the current Membership Directory, at our "lakerabun.org" website, or by contacting our Pavilion managers, Jan or Nancy, at 706-782-6110 or by email, Irapavilion@gmail.com.

Boating Safety Reminders

On behalf of the Boating Safety Committee, thanks to everyone for a safe summer on the lake. We only had one minor incident involving two jet skis at the beginning of the season. Keep the following in mind this winter:

- Be aware of debris floating in the main channels of the lake due to no boat traffic at this time of the year.
- Disconnect the battery cables on your boats to reduce potential fire hazards while boats are winterized.
- Secure all recreational equipment (paddleboards, canoes, kayaks, etc.) so they won't be blown in the lake and present hazards to other boaters on the lake.

Many LRA members expressed several concerns during the summer lake activity:

- Jet skis are coming too close to skiers and boathouses.
- Large wakes on the lake damage shorelines as well as boats in boathouses, so please respect your lake neighbors and other boaters when creating large wakes.
- Pay attention to the 100' rule.
- When entering the no wake zone into Hall's Marina, all tubers should be in boats (not still tubing) due to the boat traffic and narrow area.

Please remind your houseguests and visitors of these rules. The next Boating Safety Class will be held on Saturday, June 11, 2016.
