With the help of Dr. John Polhill, we will have a Rabun County EMS ambulance on site for our next race.


We have plans for more ways to keep our race safe and always welcome any suggestions you have.

Lake Rabun Fireboat Update

Thank you to all of our many lake residents, Georgia Power Company and the 2017 Market who have supported the capital campaign to raise funds for the purchase of a new compliant fireboat which will allow many of us to preserve our preferential current ISO rating. We have made great progress and are almost to the finish line for this fund raising campaign.

We are continuing discussions with our Rabun County Commissioners and have requested their financial participation and support so we can move ahead with the initiation of a purchase order for the boat as soon as possible, ie, hopefully before year end.

A boat manufacturer, Lake Assault Boats, in Superior, Wisconsin has been identified. They are experienced boat builders of commercial boats such as fireboats, rescue/dive boats, patrol boats, work boats, etc., and are highly regarded in the industry. We have worked directly with them to complete the specifications for our new boat. The delivery time frame is expected to be 6 to 8 months from the initiation of a purchase order.

There is a picture on the lakerabun.org home page of a fireboat that is a similar model to the one we will order.

The Fred Stewart "Shangri-La" Award

The Fred Stewart Award was created in 2001 as a memorial to Fred Stewart, the founder of Mountain Patrol, in recognition of his decades of service committed to improving the safety and well-being of the Lakemont community that he referred to as Shangri-La. Periodically, the award is presented to recognize an individual who has performed extraordinarily selfless acts beyond the call of duty for the benefit of others to protect the well-being of the members of the Lake Rabun community. Several recent recipients include Dr. Joe Mims, the Bill Davis family, Ben McCracken and Michael Crowe. Michelle Bramlett, Fred Stewart's daughter, presented the awards to our 2017 recipients. This year we had four nominees that were presented the award for their part in two incidents around the lake.

In early June, on a dark foggy night, Jack **Dickens** was traveling on Shady Lane behind an Athens Y Camp van. The van suddenly tumbled off the side of the road, flipping over and landing upside down at the bottom of the embankment.



Jack selflessly climbed down the hill and freed the young driver who was hanging by her seat belt in the toppled van. Jack carried the young lady to safety.



The other incident occurred during this year's Rabun Ramble. Anne Fleming, a longtime lake resident, was walking the course with her good friend Anne Marie Hoffman. Anne suddenly collapsed and was in cardiac arrest. Anne Marie immediately responded with CPR. Dr. John Polhill was also nearby and relieved Anne Marie in the process. In the meantime, Bill Davis ran home to retrieve his AED and delivered it to the scene. Anne was shocked multiple times with this device. We know that many were on the scene responding to this emergency, but these three were nominated by members for their immediate impact on what turned out to be a miraculous recovery by one of our own.
