Lake Rabun Fire Protection Services Update & Capital Campaign Status

First, I would like to thank all of you for responding to our Capital Campaign on Labor Day 2016. Since that time, we have made a great deal of progress and are now nearing the necessary amount to make a new fireboat a reality for Lake Rabun. We have learned a great deal since last Labor Day and have identified other expenses which will need to be covered. These include additional equipment to complete the outfitting of the new boat, funds to enlarge our marina fire station to accommodate the new boat, etc. Bottom line, we are nearing the finish line and can get there with a little more help.

We are greatly appreciative of the financial support from the Georgia Power Foundation which provided a grant of \$25,000 and excellent advice on many related matters. They have also offered additional in-kind support to make improved fire protection on our lake a reality. Please make an effort to thank our Georgia Power friends both here in Rabun County and their corporate officers. They continue to invest in the quality of our lake environment and help make it what it is today.

We also need to express our gratitude to John Murray, LWVFD Station 4 Captain, and his lieutenants for their tireless efforts in helping to move this initiative forward. Key among this effort has been the time dedicated to develop and refine the specifications for the new fireboat.

Our LRA Fire Committee has been in contact with both county officials and several of the county commissioners on numerous occasions since last Labor Day. As of now, we are awaiting several "final" quotes for the fireboat, outfitting equipment and marina station enlargement. The County has requested that we include this in our overall discussion with Darrin Giles, our County Administrator. At this point, all appear to be supportive of our cause.

Our discussions with our county officials and commissioners have not solely been focused on the fireboat. We have included the need for an additional fire station to better serve the upper end of our lake from approximately Bear Gap Cove up to the Low Gap Road Bridge. A new station in this general area would provide much better service to upper Lake Rabun, as well as truck service to cover the Crow Creek Road area and the Flat Creek community. This would potentially set the stage for this service area to establish eligibility for an improved ISO/PPC rating, which could substantially impact property insurance premiums.

We are nearing the finish line – the point where a purchase order can be placed to start the process of building our fireboat. If you have not yet had a chance to support the LRA Capital Campaign, now is the time. Your support can make the difference.

Rabun County' — Our Coming Total Solar Eclipse August 21, 2017

On Monday afternoon, the 21st of August 2017 at 2:35:45 p.m., Rabun County will be THE solar eclipse capital of Georgia. The "Line of Totality" will cross Georgia's NE corner and Rabun County is one of the few locations in our state to view the total solar eclipse. From southern Rabun County to the North Carolina border, we will experience about 2 minutes and 35 seconds of dusk-like darkness, with the pre- and post-eclipse period lasting about 90 minutes.

A total solar eclipse occurs when the moon passes in front of and totally covers the sun. This is one of the rarest of all natural events. Beginning on the Oregon coast at 1:15 p.m. Eastern Time, the "Line of Totality" will rapidly cross the US, traversing 14 states, including the NE corner of Georgia. The eclipse will then pass over a portion of South Carolina as it exits the US over the Atlantic Ocean.

This is the first time in 26 years a total solar eclipse has occurred in the United States – truly "The Great American Eclipse" – and the first coast-to-coast eclipse in many years. While a total solar eclipse occurs on average somewhere on Earth each 18 months, it is extremely rare in a single location – only once each 375 years. Since most of us can't wait for the next one, we best catch this one!

The Rabun County School System will dismiss at noon on eclipse day, and all but essential county employees will also be released to experience the eclipse. Excitement is building and we expect thousands of guests from regions far and wide to join us to view history in the making.

Your Rabun County *Tourism Development Authority* (TDA) has formed a *Solar Eclipse Coordination Committee* (SECC) whose main purpose is to coordinate and communicate

about this fabulous event. Specifically, we are planning a huge event, in coordination with Rabun Gap-Nacoochee School (RGNS), which will be both educational and fun.

Gates will open for the "OutASight Festival" at the RGNS athletic fields at 11 a.m. on eclipse day, Monday the 21st of August 2017. The festival will feature commentary from a number of distinguished astronomy professors; large jumbotron displays featuring video feed from NASA as the eclipse progresses; bands; food and craft vendors; souvenirs; and educational opportunities for young and old to learn the science behind a total solar eclipse as we watch it unfold before our eyes. Rain or shine, the eclipse will happen and so will the "OutASight Festival." Admission on campus at RGNS is only \$5/person. (Includes parking, viewing glasses – essential equipment – and informational handouts about the event.)

Solar eclipse enthusiasts from all over the world will be coming to Rabun County for some of the best viewing in the entire United States. Begin to make your plans now, and insure you are prepared for one of the truly great events in our lifetime – all right here in Rabun County!

Come join your friends and neighbors, from near and far, for a great time at RGNS and experience this unique and profound event. Bring chairs, spread a blanket, put on some suntan oil, and get ready to be astounded by nature's handiwork as we experience "Totality"!

Hemlock Report



The relatively mild winter we experienced this year in Rabun County means the insect population did not suffer much die-back and they will be thriving this spring and summer, which includes the Hemlock Wooly Adelgid. I have already noticed more of the white egg sacks on hemlock trees around the lake than usual – even on trees that have been treated. Now is the best time of year to check the needles for infestation. It's also the best time to treat your trees. If you see signs of infestation, go to the LRA website, and click on "LRA Hemlock Program" for information on resources and names of facilitators who can help you treat your trees.

Also, Save Georgias Hemlocks is trying to locate small hemlock seedlings (12 to 36 inches) to dig, pot, and use for promotions, education and reforestation programs. If you have any of these on your property, preferably not infested and healthy, and would like to donate them to this non-profit organization, please call me.

We are also looking for volunteers to help us treat hemlocks in the campground area near Lake Rabun Beach on May 6. Please call me or Bob Pledger if you can help.

Lakemont-Wiley Volunteer Fire Department

Friends and Neighbors,

We would like to express our heartfelt appreciation for the support you have shown our department throughout the last year. In 2016 our department ran over 150 calls for service. During the year we responded to medical problems, fire alarms, structure fires, boating accidents, and during the month of November our volunteers spent nearly three weeks assisting in the battle of wildfires that burned over 25,000 acres of Rabun County. Words cannot express the appreciation we have for the members of the Lake Rabun Association who have donated money, food, support, and kindness during the efforts to control the wildfires and sustained us during the 2016 year.

As the 2017 lake season begins and we approach the Memorial Day kick off, the Lakemont-Wiley Fire Department would like to remind you of a few basic items to keep your homes safe and assist our department in responding to your emergencies.

- ★ Please ensure you have 911 numbers and they are displayed on your residence in a highly visible area from the driveway (usually within 50 feet). The view of the numbers should not be blocked by trees and shrubs.
- ★ All residences located on a driveway longer than 50 feet should have similar 911 numbers displayed at the end of the driveway and on the residence. Numbers placed on a sign or post at the entrance to the right-of-way or shared driveway aid emergency responders in rapidly locating your driveway from main roads.
- ★ 911 numbers and road addresses associated with your residence should be clearly displayed on boathouses. Signs that identify your boathouse with the address you will report to 911, when phoning an emergency, significantly improves our efficiency in locating your address when responding from the waterfront.
- ★ Please ensure your homes have working smoke alarms installed and batteries are changed with the start of the season.
- ★ Clear needles, leaves and other debris from the roof, gutters, eaves, porches and decks. This reduces the chances of embers igniting your home in a wildfire situation.
- ★ Remove flammable items within 30 feet of all structures including firewood piles, portable propane tanks, boat gas, and dry and dead vegetation.
- ★ Be cautious with storage under decks or porches and mulch around your residence; items that may be exposed to a wildfire can easily catch your residence on fire. If it can catch fire, don't let it touch your house, deck, or porch.
- ★ Fire can spread to tree tops. If you have tall trees on your property, prune low hanging branches 6 to 10 feet from the ground and for smaller trees, prune low hanging branches no more than a third of the tree's height. Remove tall grasses, vines, and shrubs from under trees.
- ★ Talk to your neighbors and create a plan for how to address your wildfire safety challenges together. The installation of a standpipe can significantly impact the ability to rapidly fight a fire.

We look forward to a great 2017 with many wonderful times ahead. We ask that each family look for ways to embrace safe boating and fire safe behaviors this season. We are eternally grateful for the support we have received from the Lake Rabun Association and continue to thrive because of your generosity. Thank you for allowing us to serve you.

Boating Safety TOP 10 LIST!

- 1. **Lights on bow and stern** It's great to be seen on the lake after dusk.
- **2. Coast Guard approved life jackets** on board for each passenger swimmies for the little ones DO NOT COUNT.
- 3. A valid and operable **fire extinguisher** is required.
- 4. Have a **secondary source of light** on board such as glow sticks or a flashlight.
- 5. Make sure your registration is current.
- 6. Keep your battery terminals clean and tight.
- 7. Remember the **100 Foot Rule** Keep 100 feet from any fixed standing structure boathouse, dock etc.
- **8.** Do not tow tubes in and out of Hall's. Make sure all tubes and riders are on board as you enter.
- 9. Do not allow small children to ride in the bow of the boat (not a law, just safer).
- 10. No skiing, wake boarding, tubing or jet skiing after sunset.
