Presented to Ruddy Deas. Thanks to Ruddy for his many years of service to LRA. Some examples include maintenance of Minnehaha Trail, blocking the potential commercial rezoning of a portion of Lakemont property, leading the boater safety efforts regarding wake boats, and now overall lake safety.

-Officer Reports:

- Chairman Ruddy Deas
 - The Wake Boat Safety effort is being recast as Lake Safety and is supported by Ruddy, Robert Pittman, Wallace Bruce, Thad Warren, Neil Creech and Maurice Rosenbaum. There are three main areas of focus:
 - Legislative: These efforts include such items as increasing the buffer zone and limiting the amount
 of weight on a wakeboard/surfer boat. Our committee and the Lake Burton group are working with
 our senators to raise awareness of safety and property damage issues. We are also part of a
 coalition of 15 other states who are lobbying around these issues.

- Education: Georgia Power and DNR worked with leadership from Lake Rabun and Lake Burton to develop the boater safety signs posted at Halls. We are working to place them elsewhere on the lake. DNR has increased patrolling and citations on the lakes and the ride-along program with the Sheriff's Office continues. LRA will be creating smaller versions of this sign for distribution in the spring.
- Georgia Power: We have met with a VP at Georgia Power to raise awareness and to determine
 what kind of authority they have to enforce measures to ensure safety and limit property damage
 on the lake. We have met twice and a third meeting is scheduled.

- Foundation Report - Steve Raeber

This spring the scholarship committee selected 15 Rabun students-13 RCHS -2 Rabun Gap. With additional funds from the Christina Freeman bequest the scholarships were increased, from \$2500 to \$3000 for this class. In all, checks for \$115,000, were mailed to colleges on behalf of 43 LRA students. Most attend college in GA.

Steve shared a story about a scholarship student who returned to Rabun County. Mandy Pileski was an LRA scholar 20 years ago. She returned to Rabun County a few years ago with a PHD in psychology. Mandy established a mental health practice and also established a non-profit foundation to assist some of those in need. This summer, Anna West, one of our 2017 scholars, who will graduate from UGA with a degree in psychology, was able to intern here with Mandy.

The Foundation is active in the community assisting charities and nonprofits. Larger grants have been made to FAITH, the Food Bank, Foxfire, Rabun Habitat, A Place of Hope North Georgia, Rabun EMS and a significant grant to the new Rabun Community Dental Clinic. There are LRA members who are board members or volunteers at most of these organizations.

-Whippoorwill Award - Bob Voyles

Helen McSwain is our 2021 Whippoorwill recipient! Without Helen's efforts the Centennial Book would not have been the same beautiful coffee table book that we have now. Helen's family has been on Lake Rabun since the 1930s and she knows everyone that has old pictures of the lake. She scheduled appointments and went to house after house to scan photos – carrying her own laptop and flatbed scanner. Helen taught herself to use Photoshop and improved the quality of many of the photos she had scanned so we could use them. She also learned to colorize them. Helen was a huge help as we were looking for the final pictures for the Centennial book. Since she retired from her OB-GYN practice, Helen has served on the Board of Trustees, coordinated the clean-up of Minnehaha Falls, been a member of the Lake Rabun photo team, and joined the kayaking group.
